Instruction Manual

LED Smart Full HD Android TVTM LT-43CA320























Certain services are subject to change or withdrawal at any time, may not be available in all areas, or in 4K, HDR10+ or DOLBY VISION or DOLBY ATMOS and may require separate subscriptions.

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1 Safety Warnings

- Read all the instructions carefully before using the unit and keep them for future reference.
- Retain the manual. If you pass the unit onto a third party make sure to include this manual.
- Check that the voltage marked on the rating label matches your mains voltage.
- WARNING: Never let people (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and / or knowledge use electrical devices unsupervised.
- To avoid danger of suffocation, keep plastic bags out of reach of babies, children and domestic animals.
- Carefully attach the stand to the TV. If the stand is provided with screws, tighten the screws firmly to prevent the TV from tilting. Do not over tighten the screws and mount the stand rubbers properly.

Damage

- Please inspect the unit for damage after unpacking.
- Do not continue to operate the unit if you are in any doubt about it working normally, or if it is damaged in any way - switch off, withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

Location of Unit

- The unit must be placed on a flat stable surface and should not be subjected to vibrations.
- Do not place the unit on sloped or unstable surfaces as the unit may fall off or tip over causing serious personal injury or death.
- The mains socket must be located near the unit and should be easily accessible.
- This unit is designed for indoor, domestic use only.
- Use this TV set at an altitude of less than 2000 meters above sea level, in dry locations and in regions with moderate or tropical climates.

Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as;

- Using cabinets or stands recommended by the manufacturer of the television set.
- Only use furniture that can safely support the television set.
- Ensuring the television set is not overhanging the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Not placing the television set on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both furniture and the television set to a suitable support.
- Not standing the television set on cloth or other materials placed between the television and supporting furniture.
- Educating children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the television set or its controls.
 If your existing television set is being retained and relocated, the same considerations as above should be applied.

Wall Mounting

- Read the TV and wall mount instructions before mounting your TV on the wall.
- For TVs over 40" in size, wall mounting requires 2
 people to lift and position the TV on to the wall mount.
- The wall mount bracket is not supplied, they can be purchased from your dealer.
- Do not install the TV on a ceiling or an inclined wall.
- Only use the screws supplied with the wall mount bracket when attaching the TV to the bracket. See your TV instructions for screw type.
- Tighten the wall mount screw firmly to prevent the TV from falling. Do not over tighten the screws.
- If you are in any doubt how to mount your TV, contact a professional.

Temperature

- Avoid extreme degrees of temperature, either hot or cold. Place the unit well away from heat sources such as radiators or gas / electric fires.
- Avoid exposure to direct sunlight and other sources of heat.

Naked Flames


 Never place any type of candle or naked flame on the top of or near the unit.

Moisture

- To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or product damage, do not expose this unit to rain, moisture, dripping or splashing. No objects filled with liquids, such as vases, should be placed on the unit.
- If you spill any liquid into the unit, it can cause serious damage. Switch it off at the mains immediately.
 Withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

Ventilation

- To prevent the risk of electric shock or fire hazard due to overheating, ensure that curtains and other materials do not obstruct the ventilation vents.
- Do not install or place this unit in a bookcase, built-in cabinet or in another confined space. Ensure the unit is well ventilated.
- Make sure that there is a gap of at least 10 cm on both sides and a gap of 20 cm at the top.



Safety

- Always disconnect the unit from the mains supply before connecting / disconnecting other devices or moving the unit.
- Unplug the unit from the mains socket during a lightning storm and long inactivity periods (going on holiday).

Mains Cable

- Make sure the unit or unit stand is not resting on top of the mains cable, as the weight of the unit may damage the mains cable and create a safety hazard.
- A damaged power cord/plug can cause fire or give you an electric shock. Handle the power cord by the plug, do not unplug the TV by pulling the power cord. Never touch the power cord/plug with wet hands as this could cause a short circuit or electric shock. Never make a knot in the power cord or tie it with other cords. If the mains cable is damaged it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent, or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

Interference

 Do not place the unit on or near appliances which may cause electromagnetic interference. If you do, it may adversely affect the operating performance of the unit, and cause a distorted picture or sound.

Optimum viewing

 View the unit in moderate light to prevent eye strain. It is recommended to watch the unit from a distance
 3-7 times that of the screen height.

LCD screen

 The LCD screen is manufactured using high-precision technology. However, some tiny black points and / or bright points (red, blue or green in colour) may constantly appear on the LCD screen. These points are generated in the manufacturing process and are normal.

Screen Burn

- A characteristic of Plasma and TV Panels is that displaying the same image for a long time may cause a permanent after-image to remain on the screen. This is called screen burn. Most pictures shown on the unit will be constantly moving and fill the screen.
- Examples of images that you need to watch out for are as follows (this is not an all-inclusive list):
 - Black Bars: If black bars appear at the left / right or top / bottom of the screen, it is recommended to change the format so that the picture fills the entire screen
 - **2. TV Channel Logos:** e.g. Shopping channel logos and pricing displays especially if they are bright and stationary. Moving or low-contrast graphics are less likely to cause ageing of the screen.
 - 3. Time Displays
 - **4. Interactive Services:** Do not view a stationary page for long periods of time.
 - 5 TV Menus
 - **6. Pause Mode:** Do not leave the screen in pause mode for long periods of time, e.g. when watching videos.
- To prevent screen burn if viewing any of the above for long periods of time, reduce contrast and brightness when viewing. Once burn-in occurs it will never disappear completely.

Country Restrictions for Wireless Internet

 This device is intended for home and office use in all EU countries (and other countries following the relevant EU directive) without any limitation except for the countries mentioned below.

 The requirements for any country may change at any time. It's recommended that user checks with local authorities for the current status of their national regulations for both 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz wireless LAN's.

Earphones

- Listening to loud sounds for prolonged periods of time may permanently damage your hearing.
- Before putting on earphones, turn the volume down then put the earphones on and slowly increase the volume until you reach a comfortable listening level.

Standby

• The button on the remote control does not switch off the unit completely. The unit will continue to draw electricity from the mains supply while in standby. In the interests of safety and to avoid unnecessary energy consumption, never leave the unit in standby while unattended for long periods of time, e.g. overnight, while on holiday or while out of the house. Disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket.

Batteries

- Batteries used in the remote control for this unit are easily swallowed by young children and this is dangerous.
- Keep loose batteries away from young children and make sure that the battery holder tray is secure in the remote control. Seek medical advice if you believe a cell has been swallowed.
- Please dispose of batteries correctly by following the guidance in this manual.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire or with hazardous or flammable materials.
- The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

Supervision

- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the unit and the remote control.
- Never let anyone especially children push anything into the holes, slots or any other openings in the case this could result in a fatal electric shock.

Earthing

Apparatus connected to the protective earthing of the building installation through the MAINS connection or through other apparatus with a connection to protective earthing - and to a television distribution system using coaxial cable, may in some circumstances create a fire hazard. Service

- To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove screws. The unit does not contain any user-serviceable parts. Please leave all maintenance work to qualified personnel.
- Do not open any fixed covers as this may expose dangerous voltages.

Maintenance

- Ensure to unplug the unit from the mains socket before cleaning.
- Do not use any type of abrasive pad or abrasive cleaning solutions as these may damage the unit's surface.
- Do not use liquids to clean the unit.
- The wall socket plug is used as a disconnect device, the disconnect device should be readily accessible.
- This equipment is a Class II or double insulated electrical appliance. It has been designed in such a way that it does not require a safety connection to electrical earth.



To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other open flames away from this product at all times.



Installing / Removing the Stand



The LCD display is very fragile, and must be protected at all times when installing and removing the base stand. Be sure that no hard or sharp object, or anything that could scratch or damage the LCD display, comes into contact with it. DO NOT exert pressure on the front of the TV at any time because the screen could crack.



Attaching the Stand

- 1. Ensure the TV is switched off and not connected to the mains power supply.
- 2. Keep the protective bag on the TV to protect it. You may need to cut the protective bag before fitting the stand.
- 3. Make sure you have some help, this requires 2 people. Lay the TV down on a flat surface ideally on the edge of a table so the base of the TV slightly overhangs the edge of the table, with the back side facing up. Please make sure a soft cushioned material (such as a dry bath towel or thick piece of foam) is placed beneath the screen. Be very careful not to knock the edges of the TV, the screen is very fragile.
- **4.** Attach the stand using 4 x screws x M4 12mm.



If you don't have a table big enough, you can use the TV box. Lie the box flat, make sure you place the polystyrene back in the box first to give the box some rigidity and strength.


Mounting the TV to a Wall

Use the instructions in your Quick Start Guide if you are wall mounting your TV straight out of the box. If you have already attached the stand then follow the instructions below.



Remove the stand assembly before mounting the TV onto the wall.


- 1. Remove the 4 screws from the stand.
- 2. This TV is designed to be wall-mounted with a standard mounting kit (sold separately) designed for flat-panel TVs. Mount this TV according to the instructions included in the mounting kit. Due to space restrictions, we recommend that you make all connections before mounting on to the wall.





- If you are wall mounting your TV you may wish to buy a 90° HDMI adapter. This will help with your cable management.
- Please read this instruction manual carefully while setting up your TV.


Front View and Controls



1	LAN	Connect to a router via a LAN cable for smart TV services.
2	DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT	Optical audio out (Digital) - Connects to an audio device via an optical cable.
3	AV INPUT	Connects to composite video and AUDIO (L/R) output sockets on external video devices.
4	HDMI 1 (ARC), 2 & 3	Connects to a High-Definition (HD) signal output device, such as a set-top box, blu-ray disc player or AV receiver.
5	RF	Connects to the aerial socket on the wall with the RF coaxial cable.
6	COMMON INTERFACE	Allows the insertion of a Common Access Module.

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control



Press the catch and lift the battery
cover



2. Insert two AAA size batteries.

Make sure to match the (+) and
(-) ends of the batteries with the
(+) and (-) ends indicated in the
battery compartment.



3. Click the battery compartment back into place.



Handling the Batteries


- Improper or incorrect use of batteries may cause corrosion or battery leakage, which could cause fire, personal injury or damage to property.
- Only use the battery type indicated in this manual.
- When the batteries are exhausted, the remote will not function. Replace both batteries at the same time with new ones.
- Do not install new batteries with used ones and do not mix different types of batteries.
- Do not dispose of used batteries as domestic waste. Dispose of them in accordance with local regulations.

Handling the Remote Control

- Take care of your fingernails when you press and hold the battery release tab.
- Do not drop or cause impact to the remote control.
- Do not spill water or any liquid on the remote
- · Do not place the remote control on a wet object.
- Do not place the remote control under direct sunlight or near sources of excessive heat.
- Remove the battery from the remote control when not in use for a long period of time, as it could cause corrosion or battery leakage and may result in physical injury and/or property damage including fire.

Remote Control Operation Range

The first time you use your remote control, point the remote control at the TV no more than 5 metres from the remote control sensor on the TV and within 60° in front of the TV. The operating distance may vary depending on the brightness of the room. Once the remote control has connected to the TV via Bluetooth the operating range is 10 meters and you won't need to point it at the TV.



Remote Control

1. LED

- · Green LED lights to indicate your remote is using Bluetooth.
- Red LED will light to indicate your remote is using infrared.

2. Microphone

Speak into the microphone when using Google Assistant.

3. STANDBY Button

- · Press to switch between on and standby.
- Press for 1 second to Power Off the TV. This will enter low power standby mode.

4. Input Button

Press to switch between inputs.

5. NUMBER Buttons

Press to select a Live TV channels.

6. GUIDE Button

Press to view the Live TV Programme Guide.

7. DOT (.) button

Press to input a full stop.

8. GOOGLE PLAY button

Press to access Google Play (internet connection required).

9. YOUTUBE button

Press to access YouTube (internet connection required).

10 NETELIX Button

Connects to Netflix for viewing online TV shows and films (internet connection required).

11. PRIME VIDEO Button

Connects to Prime Video for viewing online TV shows and films (internet connection required).

12. HOME Button

• Press to view the home screen.

13. MENU Button

 Press when viewing Live TV to access the Channel and TV Options menus.

14. OK and NAVIGATION (◀▶▲▼)Buttons

- · Press OK to select items in menus.
- Press ◀▶▲▼ to navigate around menus.

15. BACK Button

Press to move back through menus.

16. EXIT Button

Press to exit menus or Apps.

17. VOLUME +/- Buttons

Press to increase and decrease the volume level.

18. CHANNEL +/- Buttons

• Press to scroll up and down the channel list.

19. GOOGLE ASSISTANT Button

Press the Google Assistant button, when the green LED appears on the remote ask Google a question.



20. INFORMATION Button

Press when viewing Live TV to see programme information.

21. MUTE Button

Press to mute or un-mute the volume.

22. FPLAY button

Press to access the Now/Next menu in Live TV.

23. REWIND - PAUSE - FAST FORWARD - PLAY - STOP Buttons

- Press to rewind videos.
- Press to Pause videos.
- Press the fast forward videos.
- Press the play videos.
- · Press to Stop videos.
- · Record button no function

24. TEXT Button

Press to access Red Button services on Live TV if available.

25. ASPECT button

Press to adjust the aspect ratio of the picture.

26. LANGUAGE Button

Press to select an alternative language if available.

27. SUBTITLE Button


Press to access the AUDIO menu where you can switch Audio Description and Subtitles on and off.

28. COLOURED Buttons

- · Press the RED button to access Red button services if available.
- Access the TELETEXT items when viewing Live TV.
- · Press the coloured buttons to select Freeview Play options.



Turning the TV On for the First Time



- 1. Connect one end of the RF coaxial cable to the aerial socket on the wall and the other end of the cable to the RF socket on the back of your TV.
- 2. Plug the TV into a mains socket and switch on at the mains.
- 3. In standby mode, press the 0 button on the remote control to turn the TV on. The LED indicator will flash for a few seconds then the TV will switch on.



Always disconnect the TV from the mains socket when not in use for a long period of time.

The 0 button on the remote control is only used for switching the TV into standby, it does not disconnect the TV from the mains power. To completely disconnect the mains power, please remove the mains plug from the mains socket.

Choosing your language and Paring your Remote Control

The first time you switch your TV on it will automatically be in the initial setup mode. This will guide you through the whole setup process of paring your remote control, selecting your desired language, connecting to the internet, signing in to your Google account and tuning in TV channels.

1. Select your Language, ENGLISH should already be highlighted then press the OK button to continue.



- 2. Now you will need to pair your remote control to your TV. Press and hold the button and the MENU button for between 5-15 seconds.
- **3.** When you see your remote on the right side on the screen highlight it and press **OK**. Your remote will now pair with your TV.




Setting up your TV using your Android Phone

When setting up your TV for the first time you'll be given 2 choices of how you would like to setup your TV. The first choice is to setup using your Android phone. The second choice is setup using the remote control. The benefit of choosing to use your Android phone is speed to setup, it will copy your Google account settings from your phone.

1. If you have an Android phone you can setup your TV using it. If not then highlight SKIP and press OK.




- 2. On your Android phone open the Google App.
- 3. Select NEXT.




- 4. Your phone will now start connecting to your TV.
- **5.** A code will appear on your phone, check its the same as the code on your TV and select NEXT.






- **6.** Select your WiFi connection.
- **7.** Confirm your fingerprint.

- 8. Choose your Google account.
- 9. Your account will now be copied to your TV.



- **10.** Enter your account password and select SIGN IN.
- 11. Now continue setup on your TV.





Setting up your TV using your Remote Control

When setting up your TV for the first time you'll be given 3 choices of how you would like to setup your TV. The first choice is to setup using your Android phone so you'll have to SKIP this. The second choice is setup using a computer and the third option is to setup using the remote control. If you don't have an Android phone or a computer then this is the option you need.

1. To setup using your Remote Control first you will need to skip the setup with your Android phone option. Highlight SKIP and press OK.




You'll now be asked to setup your WiFi so make sure your ethernet cable is connected if you're using on and if not make sure you have your WIFI password.

WIRED Connection


• If you have connected your ethernet cable to the LAN socket on the back of your TV, your TV will automatically connect to the internet.


WIRELESS Connection

2. Your TV will automatically scan for your wireless network, then show you a list of networks that its found. Highlight your network and press the **OK** button.








5. Read and accept the 'Network privacy policy' and press **OK**.



6. To sign in to your Google account highlight SIGN IN the press the **OK** button.




Sign in to your Google Account

If you already have a Google account you can sign in here using your remote control and the onscreen keyboard. You can always use a wireless keyboard if you have one, it will speed up the process.

- 7. Enter your Email address or phone number, then highlight and press **OK**.
- **8.** Enter your PASSWORD, then highlight \bigcirc and press **OK**.



Now go to the Confirm 'Terms of Service' and Google Setting section on page 22.

You now need to choose your Android setting

1. Highlight ACCEPT and press **OK**, if you agree to the Google Terms of Service, the Google Privacy Policy and Google Play Terms of Service.


2. The 'Did you know' screen will be displayed, press **OK** to view more information about how Google uses your location then press **OK** again.



4. Press **OK** to continue.

5. Choose which additional apps you want to install. Highlight ALLOW and press **OK**.

6. If you are happy to allow Google Assistant to use your information to show personalised information/recommendations, then highlight TURN ON and press **OK**.



7. If you're happy for Google to email you about the latest features and things your Assistant can do, then highlight YES and press OK.

8. Choose which additional apps you want to install. Highlight CONTINUE and press OK.

9. Press **OK** to scroll through the features on your TV.



TV Setup

You now need to select your country, set a Password for Parental controls, select Home mode and choose if to allow access to the built-in Chromecast.

1. Highlight your Region/Country and press OK.

2. Read the Terms and Conditions, then accept by pressing OK.


3. Set a password for your TV, highlight INPUT PASSWORD then press OK.

4. Input a 4 digit password using the **◆▶▲▼** buttons and **OK**.

5. Confirm the password using the ◆▶▲▼ buttons and **OK**.



6. Highlight HOME and press **OK**.




7. Select if you would like to allow the built-in Chromecast to be always available or not then press **OK**.





Selecting Chromecast ON may increase your TV energy consumption, you will be prompted if you want to continue or not.



Tuning in your TV

You now need to tune in your TV.

1. Make sure your aerial cable is connected and then highlight ONLY DIGITAL CHANNELS and press **OK**.



Make sure you have connected your aerial before tuning in your TV.

2. Your TV will now start to scan for all available TV channels. A video will play while its scanning.




If you View TV Through a Set Top Box

If you have attached a Set top box such as **Sky/Virgin** or **BT** via a HDMI cable then, allow your TV to scan for channel, it won't find any, and will finally end on the home screen. To view your set top box select the Input that you have connected it to.

3. Setup is completed, press OK.










Home Screen Overview

Once you have setup your TV, the first screen you will see will be the Home screen. This is the screen where you can access all your TVs content. It will also start to show recommendations for you over time.



Item		Description
1	Google Assistant	This is your Google Assistant, you can also access the Google Assistant by pressing the same button on the remote control.
2	Google Search	Here you can type what you're looking for, and Google will search for you.
3	Home	The Home tab show the Home screen.
4	Discover	The Discover tab helps you find new and exciting content with personalized recommendations across your streaming services.
5	Apps	The Apps tab shows all the installed apps that you have downloaded, or you can find more apps and games by opening the Google Play store and downloading them.
6	Notifications	The number indicates how many notifications you have. Click on the number to read the notifications.
7	Inputs	Click on Inputs to display the inputs list and choose an input from the list.
8	Network	Click on Network to see if you're connected to a network and to enter the Network & Internet menu.
9	Settings	Click on Settings to see the Settings menus.
10	Current Time	Displays the current time.
11	Trending Content	This is content that's advertised to you, click to view more information or watch the content.
12	Favourite apps	This shows your favourite apps. More can be added by scrolling to the end and selecting Add app to favourites.
13	On Now	The On Now row displays a list of programmes that are currently being aired. The orange bar at the bottom of each programme indicates how far through the programme you are.
14	Pre-installed apps	Click on the content from each row or scroll down and select any of the pre-installed apps (some app may require paid subscription) so you can search and play content.
15	Customise your home screen	If you scroll down to the bottom of the home screen you'll find Customise your home screen. Here you can customise the content that's displayed on your home screen, and also adjust the Play Next settings.
16	TV Guide	Click on TV Guide to display the TV Guide, where you'll see a list of all the TV channels and programmes.


Discover Tab

The Discover tab helps you find new and exciting content with personalized recommendations across your streaming services. Recommendations are based on what you've watched in the past and your interests from your Google account, or from trending and popular content in your region. The tailored suggestions are organized into topics and genres making it easier to find your next favorite movie or show.


 Navigate to the DISCOVER tab. The first time you select Discover you will see 'Set up personalised recommendations'. Select GET STARTED and press OK.



Now you need to choose your account. Hightlight your account and press OK. If you want to add another account then select ADD ANOTHER ACCOUNT.



3. You will now see all the services that are saved in your Google account. Highlight the service you want to add and press the **OK** button to select it. Once you have selected all the services you'd like to add highlight CONFIRM and press **OK**.



4. The Discover tab will now populate with recommended content from your selection. The first row shows the 'Top picks for you' and the following rows are organised in genres.



Google Assistant


Having Google Assistant built-in to your TV means that you can use Google to control your TV. Its the simplest way of controlling your TV, with one simple button press and speaking to Google, like "Hey Google, Tune to Channel 1'. Your TV will automatically switch to BBC 1 so you can watch Live TV.



Your TV must be connected to the internet to use the Google Assistant button and your remote control must be paired with your TV.

1. With the TV switched on, press the **GOOGLE ASSISTANT** button. You will see 'Hi, how can I help?' appear at the bottom of the screen.






2. Wait a second or two and when you see the colours bars speak into the remote.



The microphone is at the top of your remote control.





In this example say "Switch to BBC 1".

3. Your TV will now switch to BBC1.

Selecting Live TV



Live TV refers to channels that have been tuned in via an aerial connection. If you watch Live TV via a Set-Top box such as Sky or Virgin that will be controlled via your Set-Top boxes remote.

There are multiple ways to select Live TV. You can ask your TV by using Google Assistant, or press the **INPUT** or **FPLAY** buttons on the remote or choose from the ON NOW row on the Home screen.

Selecting Live TV using Google Assistant

You can use Google Assistant to select Live TV. Try asking to watch a specific channel number e.g. 101.

• Press the **GOOGLE ASSISTANT** button and say "tune to channel ... ". Your TV will then switch over to your desired channel number.

Selecting Live TV using the Input button


 Press the INPUT button on the remote control and your TV will switch to Live TV. It will show the last channel you had been watching.

Selecting Live TV using the FPlay button

Press the FPLAY button on the remote control and your TV will switch
to Live TV. It will show the last channel you had been watching. It will
also display an ON NOW list at the bottom of the screen. Press the BACK
button to remove the ON NOW list.

Selecting Live TV from the Home Screen

 While viewing the Home screen select any of the content from the Freeview Play ON NOW section. This is all live TV content.





Channel Selection

There are 3 ways to change the channel.

- Press the **CHANNEL** A buttons on the remote control.
- Press the 0-9 buttons to enter the channel number.
- Use Google Assistant, press the **GOOGLE ASSISTANT** button and say "Tune to channel ..."

Volume Adjustment

There are 2 ways to change the volume on your TV.

- Press the **VOLUME** + or button on the remote control.
- Use Google Assistant, press the GOOGLE ASSISTANT button and say "Volume up or down" this will change the volume by a set amount. The volume will increase or decrease in increments of 10. You can also say a specific volume level, say "Volume 20" and your TV will adjust the volume to level 20.

Muting the Volume

There are 2 ways to mute the volume on your TV.

- Press the MUTE button on the remote control the volume will mute.
- Use Google Assistant, press the **GOOGLE ASSISTANT** button and say "Mute volume" the volume will mute.
- To un-mute the TV press the MUTE or VOLUME buttons. You can also use Google Assistant by saying "Volume up" or ask for a specific volume level.

Using the Multi Function Buttons on the Bottom of the TV

The Multi Function button on the bottom of your TV can control multiple functions on your TV. It can switch your TV ON and into Standby, change channel (in Live TV), adjust the volume and access menus.

- Move the MULTI FUNCTION button left or right to adjust the volume.
- Move the MULTI FUNCTION button forwards or backwards to change channels while watching live TV.
- While watching Live TV press the MULTI FUNCTION button enter the MENU, move left, right, forwards and backwards to navigate the menu, the press to select a menu item.
- Press and hold the MULTI FUNCTION button for 2 seconds to put the TV into STANDBY.




Live TV Guide

The Guide is to help you navigate through all the possible Live TV viewing options.

The Guide supplies information such as programme listings, start and end times for all available services. In addition, detailed information about the programme is often available in the Guide (the availability and amount of programme information will vary, depending on the particular broadcaster).

This function can be used only when the Guide information is broadcast by broadcasting companies.

The Guide displays the programme details for the next 7 days.



Accessing the Guide Using the Remote


There are many ways to access the Guide. It can be accessed by pressing the **GUIDE** button on the remote control or by using Google Assistant by saying 'Show the TV Guide'.

To exit the Guide press the BACK button.

Accessing the Guide From the Home Screen

To access the Guide from the Home Screen, highlight FREEVIEW PLAY TV GUIDE and press **OK**.

To exit the Guide press the BACK button.



Selecting a Programme from the Guide

Press the ▲▼ ◀▶ buttons to select the desired programme. Press the OK button and your TV will switch to your selected programme.

Selecting a Day in the Programme Guide

You can select any day to view 7 days before or after the current day using the Schedule option.

- 1. While viewing the Guide press the RED button.
- 2. Press the ◀▶ buttons to scroll to your desired day.
- 3. Press the ▼ button to select the time then press the OK button. The guide will now display the programmes for your chosen day and time.



Recommended Programmes

While viewing the Guide press the **GREEN** button. Scroll down the list or categorises to see recommended programmes for each category. Select the programme that you wish to view.

Press the **BACK** button to return to the Guide.



Catch up Services

If you would like to search for content in a particular catch up then press the YELLOW button. Then press the ◀▶ buttons to scroll to your desired catch up service and press **OK** to enter it.

Press the YELLOW button again to exit the Catch up search and return to the Guide.



Searching for a Programme in the Guide

If you would like to search for a specific programme you can search for it by typing in the programme name. Press the **BLUE** button. Then start typing the programme name, as you type a list will start to appear.

To view the programme you have search for, highlight the programme in the list and press OK. The catch up service will open and your programme will be displayed.



4 Live TV

- **1.** While watching a TV channel press the **LIVE TV** button. Programme information will be displayed.
- 2. Press the ▼ button and the Mini Guide will appear. The top line of the Mini Guide shows a list of channels, your current channel will be highlighted.

Freeview Play ON NOW Guide

Press the FPLAY button to access the ON NOW guide. Here you will be able to see what's on while still



This row is the On Now row, it shows you all the programmes that are currently on. Scroll along the row to see all the available programmes, press **OK** to view one. Press the **COLOURED** buttons to see the below options.



On [TV channel selected]



Scroll and highlight a channel then press the RED button and you will see all the programmes available on your highlighted channel.

On Demand Players



Press the **YELLOW** button and you will see all the On Demand Players.

[TV channel selected] Recommends



Scroll and highlight a channel then press the **GREEN** button and you will see recommended programmes on your highlighted channel.

Search



Press the **BLUE** button and you will be able to search for a programme.

Channel List

The Channel list show a list of all TV and Radio channels/stations that are available on your TV.

- 1. To access the CHANNEL LIST press the OK button while watching a TV channel.
- **2.** To view a channel from the list scroll up or down the list, highlight your chosen channel and press the **OK** button.
- Press the RED and GREEN buttons to scroll a page at a time, to make finding a channel quicker.



Selecting More Content from the On Demand Players

If you can't find what you're looking for in the Channel list then by pressing the Yellow button you can access all the available On Demand Players, where you can search for extra content.

- While viewing the Channel List press the YELLOW button. The ON DEMAND PLAYERS menu will be displayed.
- Highlight your desired ON DEMAND PLAYER and press the OK button to access it.



Adding a Channel to Your Favourites List

If you watch a few channels regularly you can add them to a favourite list so they are easy to find.

- 1. Highlight the channel then press the **BLUE** button. A heart will appear next to the channel to show its been added as a favourite.
- 2. If you want to remove a channel from your favourites list simply highlight it and press the **BLUE** button, the heart symbol will disappear.
- To access your Favourites list press the ► button and the FAVOURITES LIST will be displayed.

4 Live TV

Red Button + (Interactive services)

Red button + services are available on BBC TV and Radio channels. The services are gradually changing to an internet based service rather than the conventual over air (though your aerial). To make the most out of the Red Button + services make sure your TV is connected to the internet. You can also access BBC iPlayer through RED button +.

Accessing the Information

1. While watching Live TV press the **TEXT** button to display the main information page. You may see slightly different looking pages depending if your TV is accessing the page over air or via the internet.

2. Follow the instructions on the interactive services page and move around the page by pressing ▲◀▶▼, SELECT, RED, GREEN, YELLOW, BLUE or 0-9 buttons etc.

To change digital teletext services, you will need to exit the current text service and change channels. Then enter the text service on the newly selected channel.



Alternative

You may press the **RED** button to display the interactive services information when you see a red "press ●" logo in the top right corner of the screen (e.g. BBC services). This will now display the Red Button menu and available information categories.

To access the pages, use navigation buttons to highlight item required and press the **SELECT** button to select.

Follow on screen prompts for other functions.

3. Press **TEXT** to exit.

Listening to the Radio

You can listen to radio stations through your Live TV or by asking Google Assistant to play a radio station.

1. While watching Live TV Press the **GUIDE** button. Navigate to a radio station, they are usually towards the end of the Guide in channel numbers 700+.



Alternative

Ask Google Assistant, press the **GOOGLE ASSISTANT** button and ask for a radio station.










Making a Play Next Row

- Partitioned hard drives are NOT supported. If your hard drive has two partitions such as one NTFS and one FAT32. The NTFS partition may not work or could work slowly.

Choose from VIDEO, PHOTO, AUDIO or TEXT to see your files. Use the PLAY, PAUSE, STOP, FAST FORWARD, REWIND to view your files.





Other media players are available, check the App Store.

Checking and Formatting a USB Drive

You can check that amount of available storage on your USB device or format the device from the STORAGE menu.

- 1. Press MENU and go to SETTINGS DEVICE PREFERENCES STORAGE. Your USB storage device will be shown under REMOVABLE STORAGE. Here you will see the total space available on the device.
- **2.** To see the remaining storage capacity of your USB device highlight the device and press **OK**. You will now see how the storage is being used on your device including the available storage.






Allowing your TV to power on via your Google Home Speaker

- You also need to make sure Chromecast built-in is active. Go to SETTING APPS

HDMI-ARC Connection

To enjoy the ARC function, please ensure your ARC-compliant audio devices are connected by an HDMI cable that support the ARC function to the **HDMI 1(ARC)** port of your ARC-compliant TV. When correctly set up, you can use your TV remote control to adjust the volume output (VOL +/- and MUTE) of the connected audio device.

- **1.** Make sure your TV and ARC-compliant device are disconnected from the main and switched off.
- Connect your ARC-compliant device to your TV making sure you use the HDMI1 (ARC) socket on the side of the TV. The plug in and switch on at the mains.



Connecting a USB Storage Device



You must use a USB storage device with a minimum of 2GB of storage space.

- 1. Switch off the TV before connecting any USB storage device.
- 2. Connect your USB storage device to the USB port of your TV. If your USB device is powered by the main, plug the connected devices into the mains socket and switch on.
- 3. Press the **STANDBY** button on the remote control to turn on your TV



CI (Common Interface)




